**How to get to Tartu:** all necessary information how to get to Tartu you'll find <https://visittartu.com/bus>

- Those who are planning to come by car should inform us in advance that we could arrange you a parking permit. Otherwise, parking is chargeable in all area of the city centre.
- Those who come to Tartu via Tallinn, the easiest way to come to Tartu is by bus (2,5 hours). There are buses from the Tallinn Bus Station and Tallinn Airport every hour, but we remind you to book your bus ticket in advance <https://www.tpilet.ee/en>.
- Train connection between Tallinn and Tartu is also very comfortable and fast and takes 2 hours. There are several trains from Tallinn train station (Balti Jaam) and from Ülemiste (close to the airport). Information about the timetable and tickets is available [www.elron.ee](http://www.elron.ee).
- There are direct flights from Helsinki to Tartu. Finnair operated flights take 50 minutes, and tickets can be purchased from the Finnair website [www.finnair.com](http://www.finnair.com).
