Objectives (bullet points)	<p>The main objective of the action is to intensify cluster and business network cooperation across European countries and also across sectorial boundaries and to support the establishment of European Strategic Cluster Partnerships to lead international cluster cooperation in fields of strategic interest towards third countries beyond Europe.</p> <p>By reinforcing cluster and business network cooperation and supporting the shaping of 'European Strategic Cluster Partnerships – Going International' (ESCP-4i) (i.e. European meta-clusters) in a more strategic manner at European level, this action will help European SMEs access or maintain their positions at global value chains, strengthen their resilience at global markets and take a leading position globally. This action focuses on the promotion of cluster internationalisation where interested consortia have the opportunity to develop and implement a joint internationalisation strategy and support SME internationalisation towards third countries beyond Europe. Objectives (bullet points)	<p>Scope:</p> <p>The purpose of this topic is to develop a one-stop shop platform providing the necessary technical, regulatory, financial and socio-economic expertise as well as assistance to cities for developing and implementing their climate action plans, and related social innovation action plans. The project can involve research organizations, academia, industry including social entrepreneurs, the financial sector including impact financiers, investors, philanthropists, NGOs, national and local authorities and citizens. The project should also encompass the management of competitive calls addressed to third parties to fulfil the objectives of this action. The platform should facilitate the coordination of ongoing European activities in the area of climate neutrality for cities and should be sustainable, scalable and self-financed beyond the life of the action. Objectives (bullet points)	<p>Scope: The planned Horizon Europe Mission on Adaptation to Climate Change, including Societal Transformation, will test, evaluate and upscale a range of adaptation solutions with the aim to trigger societal transformations among key community systems (i.e., health; primary production including agriculture, forestry, fisheries and aquaculture; water; environment, including biodiversity; and infrastructure including clean energy and transport) that are central to resilience building and sustainable growth. Changes in citizens’ and consumers’ behaviors towards more sustainable patterns can happen through education, awareness raising, citizen science, observation and monitoring of their environmental impacts, civic engagement and social innovation. It is essential to directly involve citizens and communities in contributing to climate action and protecting the environment, thereby encouraging them to change their personal behavior and their mindsets, reducing their carbon and environmental footprint and taking action at the individual and collective level. To decarbonize Europe, land-based and offshore renewables must become the main energy source, while keeping the stability and resilience of the European Energy System. 	<b>Demonstration of systemic solutions for the territorial deployment of the circular economy</b>
Funding Programme	Horizon 2020 Framework Programme
Deadline	Deadline: 26 January 2021 17:00:00 Brussels time
Objectives (bullet points)	<p>Scope:</p> <p>Boosting circularity is part of the policy response to address systemic crisis such as climate change, pollution, waste generation, and biodiversity loss. Circular economy can play an important role in the EU's recovery from the adverse socio-economic and environment impacts of the COVID-19 crisis, by providing systemic solutions for sustainable growth and economic recovery. As indicated in the European Green Deal Communication, with increasing global consumption and growing pressure on resources there is an urgent need to decouple economic growth from resource use and to ensure a swift transition to climate-neutral and circular solutions. Europe also needs to increase its resilience in the face of uncertainty in the supply of critical raw materials and to increase the security of its value chains such as for example the new Circular Economy Action Plan key product value chains: batteries and vehicles, electronics and ICT, packaging, plastics, textiles, construction and buildings, food, water and nutrients. A circular economy which is sustainable, regenerative, inclusive and just can help our economies to function within the boundaries of our planet by restoring natural systems, reducing GHG emissions and minimizing loss of natural capital and biodiversity. It can also connect environmental policies with social justice through just transition ensuring environmental sustainability, jobs and social inclusion. Proposals funded under this topic will form part of the demonstration projects for the implementation of the European Commission's Circular Cities and Regions Initiative (CCRI) and must be carried out in close cooperation and coordination with it. The CCRI is part of the new Circular Economy Action Plan and aims to support the implementation of circular economy solutions at local and regional scale.</p>
Eligibility & Partnership	A cross-sectoral demonstration project for the territorial deployment of a circular and climate-neutral economy. Examples of relevant actors for a cluster are: public administrations and utilities; private sector services and industries, including small and medium enterprises (SMEs), scientific and innovator communities; financial intermediaries; civil society, including citizens and non-governmental organizations and philanthropy.
Budget specifications	The Commission considers that proposals requesting a contribution from the EU of between EUR 10 to 20 million would allow the specific challenge to be addressed appropriately. Nonetheless, this does not preclude submission and selection of proposals requesting other amounts.

	<b>Testing and demonstrating systemic innovations in support of the Farm-to-Fork Strategy</b>
Funding Programme	Horizon 2020 Framework Programme
Deadline	Deadline: 26 January 2021 17:00:00 Brussels time
Objectives (bullet points)	<p>The Farm to Fork Strategy, which is at the heart of the European Green Deal, aims to address the challenges and accelerate the transition to sustainable food systems, to ensure that the economic, social and environmental foundations of food and nutrition security are not compromised for current and future generations. It places emphasis on enabling a “just transition” for all actors of the food systems, in which also social inequalities are reduced, food poverty is addressed, and a fair income for all actors is ensured. Concerted efforts are needed to test, demonstrate and upscale innovative systemic solutions to achieve the Farm to Fork targets and objectives in this decade. A range of activities will support the deployment and scaling up of innovations that contribute to the objectives of the Farm-to-Fork Strategy. Proposals will test, pilot and demonstrate innovative systemic solutions (TRL 5-7) to one of the following six subtopics, corresponding to urgent and pressing food systems’ challenges:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Subtopic A. [2021] Achieving climate neutral farms by reducing GHG emissions and by increasing farm-based carbon sequestration and storage (IA)</li> <li>• Subtopic B. [2021] Achieving climate neutral food businesses by mitigating climate change, reducing energy use and increasing energy efficiency in processing, distribution, conservation and preparation of food (IA)</li> <li>• Subtopic C. [2021] Reducing the dependence on hazardous pesticides; reducing the losses of nutrients from fertilizers, towards zero pollution of water, soil and air and ultimately fertilizer use Proposals have to address all challenges (those related to pesticides, and to fertilizers, and to losses of nutrients) specified under Subtopic C. ] (IA)</li> <li>• Subtopic D. [2021] Reducing the dependence on the use of antimicrobials in animal production and in aquaculture (IA)</li> <li>• Subtopic E. [2021] Reducing food losses and waste at every stage of the food chain including consumption, while also avoiding unsustainable packaging (IA)</li> <li>• Subtopic F. [2021] Shifting to sustainable healthy diets[12], sourced from land, inland water and sea, and accessible to all EU citizens, including the most deprived and vulnerable groups (IA)</li> </ul>
Eligibility & Partnership	Adopting a multi-actor and cross-sectoral approach engaging practitioners (primary producers, processors, retailers, food service providers, consumers), public and private institutions (governmental institutions, NGOs, industry) and citizens from farm to fork to co-create, test and demonstrate solutions from production to consumption, in practice, on a European scale but with attention for regional and sectoral needs and contexts (environmental, socioeconomic, geographical, cultural). Foster collaboration, building bridges and breaking silos between actors of the food chain and

	between primary sectors as well as collective action. Take specific care to engage young professionals (e.g., young farmers, young fishers, young researchers, young entrepreneurs, etc.), SMEs, consumers and citizens.
Budget specifications	The Commission considers that proposals requesting from EUR 6 million up to 12 million would allow the specific challenge to be addressed appropriately under each of these subtopics (A), (B), (C), (D), (E), or (F). Nonetheless, this does not preclude submission and selection of proposals requesting other amounts.

	<b>Maritime Spatial Planning (North Sea and Baltic Sea)</b>
Funding Programme	European Maritime and Fisheries Fund
Deadline	Deadline: 10 November 2020 17:00:00 Brussels time
Objectives (bullet points)	<p>The objective of this call for proposals is to support the establishment and implementation of Maritime Spatial Plans in line with the objectives pursued in the framework of the MSP Directive. More specifically, this action intends to support Member States in setting up maritime spatial plans and ensuring that plans are coherent and coordinated across marine regions concerned. The deadline for Member States to adopt their Maritime Spatial Plans is 31 March 2021. In this context, applicants are required to address the following priorities in their proposals:</p> <p>Support the work of MSP competent authorities and/or inter-ministerial bodies in the establishment and adoption of maritime spatial plans;</p> <p>Where relevant, support the development of cross-border cooperation on MSP with bordering Member States and third countries with a view to ensure that maritime spatial plans are coherent and coordinated across marine regions concerned;</p> <p>Making use of the best available data and organize the sharing of information, necessary for maritime spatial plans, by using relevant mechanism and tools (e.g. INSPIRE, EMODNet).</p> <p>Applicants should identify one (or maximum two), challenge(s) and build their proposal around the response(s) to such challenge(s). Activities that can be funded</p> <p>Projects must undertake one or more of the following main activities as part of the project implementation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Specific activities aimed at implementing provisions set out in articles 6, 7, 8 and 9 of the MSP Directive (notably the setting-up and adoption of maritime spatial plans);</b></li> <li>• <b>Specific activities aimed at implementing provisions set out in article 10 of the MSP Directive (Data use and sharing);</b></li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Specific activities aimed at implementing provisions set out in article 11 of the MSP Directive (Cooperation among Member States);</b></li> <li>• <b>Specific activities aimed at implementing provisions set out in article 12 of the MSP Directive (Cooperation with third countries).</b></li> </ul> <p>In addition, applicants should include in their project the following complementary activities/tasks to support the above core activities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Establishment of a Steering Committee (SC) to ensure the overall strategic steering of the project. The AC should be composed of a maximum of five recognized experts in MSP or in relevant fields of activity. The Commission and EASME may participate in an observer capacity only.</li> <li>• Working procedures defining how the project and the SC will operate (assigning clear roles and responsibilities, describing the decision-making process, frequency of meetings etc.).</li> <li>• An opening and closing conference.</li> </ul>
Eligibility & Partnership	Applicants must be public authorities or bodies in charge of maritime spatial planning of those coastal Member States which are responsible for MSP in the selected area. Other legal entities shall be considered eligible applicants provided that they are endorsed by the public authorities or bodies in charge of maritime spatial planning at national level in the related coastal Member States.
